Project Title: Impact of Community Economic Characteristics on Financial Hardship among Adolescent and Young Adult Cancer Survivors

Planned research population (eligibility criteria):

This study will combine data from adolescent and young adult (age 15-21) survivors who returned baseline and follow-up 6 (medium) questionnaires. We require participants' address during the time of survey completion. We will merge county-level income, income inequality, neighborhood deprivation, cost of living and food security data from outside sources: the American Community Survey and Neighborhood Opportunity files. Proposed specific aims:

Aim 1: Describe patterns and trends in financial hardship and community economic characteristics in AYA survivors compared to sibling controls.

Aim 2: Examine the association between financial outcomes and the community economic characteristics in AYA cancer survivors.

Summary: Research has shown adolescent and young adult (AYA) cancer survivors experience financial hardship and food insecurity following cancer treatment (Zheng et al., 2020). Non-medical financial needs include worry about food, housing, retirement and accrual of debt (Ketterl et al., 2019). Less is known about the relationship between community-level economic characteristics and AYA survivors' financial needs. A social determinants of health framework will guide this study.

Design: Serial, cross sectional analysis or mixed linear regression models if there are repeated measures. Analyses will investigate associations of community economic characteristics and patient-reported financial outcomes, adjusted for nesting at the county level.
