Adult Survivors of Childhood Cancer: A Report from the

Childhood Cancer Survivor Study (CCSS)

Planned research population (eligibility criteria)

The study sample will consist of all 5-year survivors who returned both FU6 (medium) survey and FU7 surveys.

Proposed specific aims

The overarching goal of this study is to assess the consequences of financial hardship on healthcare utilization, preventive and screening practices, and health behaviors of adult survivors of childhood cancer. Financial hardship data collected from CCSS FU6 medium survey and healthcare utilization, adherence to recommended surveillance, and physical activity data from FU7 will be utilized for this study. Medical records will be used to abstract patient-, disease-, and treatment-level data.

Aim 1: To study the association between financial domains and the rates of emergency department visits and inpatient hospitalizations

Hypothesis: Survivors with higher financial hardship (scores for material, psychological, and behavioral domains and those with a history of being sent to debt collection and filing for bankruptcy) will report increased emergency department visits and inpatient hospitalization during the study reporting period.

Aim 2: To assess the impact of financial hardship on adherence to risk-based and population-based screening recommendations

Hypothesis: Survivors with higher financial hardship (scores for material, psychological, and behavioral domains and those with a history of being sent to debt collection and filing for bankruptcy) will report lower adherence to recommended cardiovascular sequalae, osteonecrosis, breast cancer, colorectal cancer, and cervical cancer screening.

Aim 3: To assess the impact financial hardship on survivors' physical activity

Hypothesis: Survivors with higher financial hardship (scores for material, psychological, and behavioral domains and those with a history of being sent to debt collection and filing for bankruptcy) will report higher physical inactivity.
